

Chain of Hearts, Rosary Vine, String of Hearts, there are many names for one of our favourite easy-care trailing houseplants!

Here are some of our top care tips to help your Chain of Hearts love life.



On average, the Chain of Hearts is a relatively easy-care plant.
It requires little attention and can be incredibly durable. All you need to know is the environment your Chain of Hearts likes to live in, and how to adapt that environment if necessary to

ensure your Chain of Hearts stays happy and loving life!

SUN

Which room is the brightest room in your house? No matter what room it is, this is the room your Chain of Hearts wants to live in. Chain of Hearts love bright light but they do not want to be in direct sunshine. So be careful not to fry them.

If you are keeping your Chain of Hearts outdoors (which you definitely can if you want to!) it's best to place it somewhere that has bright shade or filtered sunshine. Under a tree, under the covered section of your deck or outside space, where your Chain of Hearts can enjoy lovely bright light that is not going to burn!

WATER

Your Chain of Hearts does not need a lot of water. Although the Chain of Hearts isn't technically a succulent, you can often treat it like one!

During the dry months your Chain of Hearts needs to be watered every two to three days. But it is incredibly important that your Chain of Hearts dries out completely between waterings. Just like succulents, overwatering your Chain of Hearts will be the death of it!

During the more wet months of the year, your Chain of Hearts will only need watering once a week at most because it will take longer to dry out between waterings.

SOIL

For your Chain of Hearts, well draining soil is essential. We recommend a succulent & cactus soil mix or half orchid/half succulent soil.

RE-POTTING

Although your Chain of Hearts does not necessarily need to be re-potted or transplanted due to it being a trailing plant that will not grow out of its pot very quickly. However, you can re-pot your plant as you see fit. If you are going to re-pot it, we recommend doing so in the Summer or Spring.

FERTILISING

Your Chain of Hearts does not need frequent or a significant amount of fertilising. However, if you think your Chain of Hearts could do with a pick-me-up the best thing you can do for it is apply a balanced liquid houseplant fertiliser (such as the Yates Thrive Houseplant Liquid Plant Food) in the Spring.

PRUNING

Because you want your Chain of Hearts to trail, very little pruning is needed. The only time pruning could be necessary is when removing dead stems, triming the length of your plant, or when propogating cuttings.
